



Advanced Study Course in

Interreligious dialogue and International relations

1. 1. Identity

The Scuola Superiore di Studi Storici of the University of San Marino and the Istituto Superiore di Scienze Religiose "A. Marvelli" of the dioceses of Rimini and San Marino-Montefeltro, in agreement with the National Service for Higher Studies in Theology and Religious Sciences of the Bishops' Conference of Italy and the Theology Faculty of Emilia-Romagna, will hold, after the 1st edition (2018-2020), a new edition, as of the 2022-2023 academic year, of the Advanced Study Course in "Interreligious Dialogue and International Relations".

From an objective approach to the religious phenomenon, capable of holding together *historicity* and *comparison* of the different religious cultures, the Course aims at elaborating an epistomologically founded culture of interreligious dialogue, conviviality and International relations, as these are essential premises to stem any form of radicalism and fundamentalism or clash of civilisations.

The Course will particularly focus on the *Balkan and Mediterranean Areas*, also in view of fostering an innovative and concrete development of networks of solidarity, promotion of peace as well as interreligious and intercultural cohabitation. The initiative also originates fromb8 the conviction that a United Europe in terms of politics, culture, economics and social entity is staking its future in a renewed dialogue with the East and that only mutual understanding can make it possible for the different Eastern and Western European religious cultures to meet in view of a renewed European identity.

Nowadays knowledge of religion, dialogue and constructive confrontation between the various social and religious communities play a major part culturally and spiritually as well as socially and politically, including the issue of International relations, while at the same time becoming a major stake-holder in the integration and pacification processes.

The Course will be taught over a two year period for a total of **60 ECTS** (University Credit Units), corresponding to a First Level Master's Degree.

2. Scope and Methods

The Advanced Study Course is designed to offer an accurate specialised knowledge of the major Religions, how they interconnect and interrelate with the different geopolitical and cultural contexts. The intention is therefore to provide the specific skills, methods and techniques required to scientifically face the challenges and the changes regarding the relation between religions, cultures and societies by studying the hermeneutics of sources, traditions and their historical and cultural development in the contemporary context.

The objective is to therefore to provide a systematic and organic understanding of the various expressions and present-day needs of the *homo religiosus*, the increasing public and political part that Religions find themselves playing in our global world, without ever artificially separating the theological elaboration pertaining to every religious tradition from the concrete present capacity to relate to the cultures of mankind and the major challenges of the new millennium.

The syllabus will explore the anthropological, cultural, linguistic, philosophical, theological and mystical aspects of the various religious traditions in order to get a deeper understanding of the roots of the various civilisations and cultural identities, their historical and political developments, their spread and influence.

Furthermore it will seek to generate autonomous research skills in the field of religious history and other disciplines relating to the religious phenomenon, with particular reference to the study of the many ethical, legal and political (both religious and secular) systems that are present in our contemporary society.

The method envisaged will be that of holding together the relations between identity and difference, between personal and public dimensions of religion, also in order to foster a more grounded rediscovery of choices in the face of the challenges that pluralism and globalisation have presented and continue to present to each and every Religion, and *in primis* to Christianity.

3. Recipients, requisites and professional profiles

The *Advanced Study Course* is particularly suited to those who operate or who intend to operate in strategic sectors of International relations as well as interreligious and intercultural dialogue and who require specific training in the knowledge of major cultures and religious traditions of mankind.

Thanks to its unique and systematic approach to the religious phenomenon, broadened to include the current social and political context, the course also addresses the needs of professionals who require specific interreligious and intercultural skills.

In particular to:

- Graduate and Post Graduate students in Contemporary History and History of Christianity
- Graduate students in Theological Studies
- Graduate and Post Graduate students in History of Religions, Philosophy of Religions, Eastern Religions
- Graduate and Post Graduate students in Law Studies, History of International Relations, History of Political Theories, *et similia*
- Graduate and Post-Graduate in Literature and Philosophy as well as Political Science
- Young Diplomats from the whole Balkan and Mediterranean area
- Operators involved in Ecumenical and Interfaith Dialogue
- Individuals working in the field of International relations, Voluntary organisations, etc.

Anyone with a three-year Degree preferably in History, Law, Literature and philosophy may enrol in this *Advanced Study Course*. Holders of a three-year Degree in Religious Studies, a Baccalaureate in Theology, a five-year Degree in Religious Studies, teachers of Catholic Religious Education in secondary schools (pupils aged 11-19), teachers of Law, History, Philosophy and other Humanistic Studies may also enrol.

The syllabus is oriented to training expert professionals with specific skills in the emerging sector of interreligious and intercultural dialogue, mostly in connection with International relations and complex organisations that characterise our globalized postmodern societies. The course was particularly designed for the following *professional profiles*:

- Researchers in Religious Science from Universities based in Europe as well as in the Balkan and Mediterranean Area
- Members of the Diplomatic and Consular Corps of European countries as well as Balkan and Mediterranean Area

- International experts and consultants in the field of International relations, cultural policies and social integration
- Intercultural mediators capable of playing an active part as integrating players within various institutions (social services and shelters in charge of migrants and asylum seekers, economic institutions, trade unions, etc.)
- Trainers and/or teachers specialising in interreligious and intercultural dialogue training
- University researchers and operators specialising in International (political, institutional, humanitarian, etc.) relations
- Project Managers in charge of integration and development training/educational programmes
- Teachers of Catholic Religion and History of Religions
- Experts in interreligious and intercultural communication
- Operators specialised in International projects relating to peace-enforcing, interreligious dialogue and International voluntary work
- Co-ordinators in charge of projects relating to global awareness education, social inclusion and cultural integration.

4. Participants

The number of applicants to the *Advanced Study Course* will be limited to 35 students and the course will be activated only upon reaching a minimum of 20 ordinary students.

Should the number of applicants exceed the maximum threshold envisaged, a commission will be set up for the purpose of selecting participants. Beside the documentation attached to the application, a preliminary interview with individual applicants may be required in order to carry out said selection.

5. Organisation and Syllabus

The Course will be **condensed over a single academic year.** The study programme is organised in 2 semesters and includes the following courses and lecturers:

8. Lecturers

In addition to its qualified team of specialist lecturers involved in the day-to-day teaching programmes, most of them with ongoing National and International academic records, every year the Scuola can rely on the teaching and scientific contribution of experts and scholars of proven International academic relevance. Distinguished representatives of Orthodox Churches, Reformed Denominations as well as Judaism, Islam, Buddhism, Hinduism and Shinto religious traditions are also engaged as *visiting professors*.

9. Course organisation (lectures)

Major Course Lectures will be held on the "A. Marvelli" ISSR premises in Rimini. Lectures will be supplemented with full-day study sessions, seminars and workshops that may be held on other premises (Scuola Superiore di Studi Storici - University of the Republic of San Marino; Castelli (Municipalities) of Città, Domagnano and Serravalle of the Republic of San Marino; Pan-European Trust of the Republic of San Marino).

Lectures will be held on two days a week, in the evenings, from November to May, with an intensive period over the first two weeks of July.

Teaching activities will be offered simultaneously in hybrid mode: with a predefined number of students present in the classroom and others online via videoconference.

10. Final Degree

The Final Degree will be awarded upon completion of the course of study, attendance of which is mandatory (2/3 of all course work) as well as passing the final paper, after gaining the credits envisaged for the course itself. Conditions for taking the final paper will be defined in the Education Regulations. 8 ECTS will be allocated to the final paper. The **Advanced Study University Degree in** *Interreligious Dialogue and International Relations* is awarded both by the University of the Republic of San Marino and the Istituto Superiore di Scienze Religiose, based on the *Memorandum of Understanding* signed by both partner Institutions.

11. Applications

Applications are open from September 1st to October 15th 2022. Enrolment fees are \notin 2.000 and may be paid in two (or three) instalments.

Accommodation including board and lodgings can be made available to students coming from other regions of Italy or from other Countries for the entire study period, upon request and subject to availability.
